## Blackboard Learn to Ultra: Blog & Wiki Alternatives

As the university transitions from Learn to Ultra, the blog and wiki assignment features will no longer be available within the LMS. This document provides a brief overview of alternatives for each of these tools should you wish to continue utilizing these assignments within the classroom.

## Blog Tool Alternatives

| <b>Discussions Feature</b> (Within<br>Blackboard Ultra) | Consider transitioning blog assignments to a weekly discussion board. Individual blog posts will be replaced with discussion threads, and comments with replies/posts.  |
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| <b>Journal Feature</b><br>(Within Blackboard Ultra)     | For assignments where the intent of the blog is to be privately viewed between<br>the student and instructor, consider transitioning these assignments to a weekly<br>journal entry.  |
| <u>EduBlogs</u>   | <ul> <li>Website where instructors can create a blog for their classroom and invite their students to participate. Edublogs includes the following highlights:</li> <li>Blog can be set to public or private</li> <li>Tools and features specifically for educators</li> <li>Eree account option for educators</li> </ul> |

## Wiki Tool Alternatives

| Microsoft Office 365 | Instructors can create an editable Word document within their Microsoft Office<br>365 account and share a link to that document (with editing privileges) to<br>students within the assignments' Blackboard description. Students can also<br>access MS Office 365 through their Montco Connect homepage. |
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| <u>Padlet</u>        | Website in which instructors (or students) can create boards with different visual<br>layout styles. Instructors can create a board and invite students to edit or add<br>information to that board. This tool is also great for classroom introductions,<br>timeline projects, micro-blogging, etc.      |
